Pastor's Corner

Campus Lutheran is taking the "Forgiving Challenge!"

Forgiveness. Have you ever taken time to really think about what it means? Whether it's a concept or a feeling or even an obligation? Jesus, knowing how important forgiveness is, included it in the prayer He taught us by teaching us to ask God to forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. Webster's dictionary defines forgiveness as an action, and the word forgive as "to cease to feel resentment against an offender," which makes forgiveness the act of ceasing to feel resentment toward another person. That can be difficult at times.

Each of us has felt resentment or anger toward another person when we've felt we've been wronged. When the wrong is something that is not too serious, we can quickly let go of those negative feelings and restore the relationship. But there are also times when the wrong is something so unfathomable that the anger and resentment is so deep within us that we can't move beyond it. The feelings start to eat away at us and become so strong that they start to motivate our behavior, even sometimes to the point where they become all consuming, limiting our ability to live life.

Jesus is well aware of the trespasses we inflict on each other and encourages us to do the very thing that can be extremely difficult—to forgive. Starting during the week of **February/March 19** through the week of **March 26** Campus Lutheran will be going through a study that will challenge us understand forgiveness not as an obligation or duty but as a life-giving gift.

TREASURER'S REPORT - CHRIS LOHMANN

CLC 2022 Ministry—By the Numbers

Our congregation has continued to be blessed through 2022 as we have carried out our mission and vision. We can be thankful that our regular giving income has come close to our budgeted amounts, while other income sources, including three grants received by the Missouri District to support our ministries, have boosted our "other income" sources.

On the expense side, we must give credit to our staff and ministry teams who have been wise with their spending and finding ways to be efficient. All of our ministry teams have kept total expenses below their approved budgets in our spending plan. At the end of the year, we were left with a surplus of just over \$47,000.

Thanks to the generosity of many members making contributions above and beyond their regular giving toward debt retirement, we have reduced our loan principal significantly over the last year. In October our loan balance dropped below \$1 million. And near the end of the year, we received several large gifts (which is why our cash balance on the statements below seem large). A couple weeks ago, I mailed a \$336,000 check to be applied to the principal! Our loan balance as of the end of January is now down to just over \$657,000!

I continue to track contributions designated for debt reduction in a separate fund and pay down the principal each month with those dollars. We are currently making the interest payments as part of our spending plan. Our LCEF loan will convert to a regular principal + interest payment in August 2023.

May the Lord continue to bless our congregation and our ministry into 2023 and beyond!
