What is Quarterlife?

Quarterlife is a group of young to younger adults, who have either finished college or are in graduate school. This small group is made up of mostly did 20's to early 30's and is designed to reach those who have kind of fallen in-between the cracks: they have graduated from college, and are moving on from worship with the Gathering (the college-aged group), yet still want the camaraderie of fellow young adults who are at their stage in life.

What does Quarterlife do?


Quarterlife is a small group that has 3 main functions. The first function is Bible study; we meet every week (or every other week in the case of this semester) in either "Faith" room or "Hope" room. Most of our Bible studies have been thematic and discuss the intersection of culture and Scripture. This year we started with a study called "Half-truths" which looked at common phrases that we often associate with the Bible but are only partially true (such as "God will never give you more than you can handle"). Then we had the study "What does this mean?" a study that looked at signs and symbols in the Bible and Christian artwork and architecture. At this time we are finishing up our study on C.S. Lewis' *Mere Christianity*, and will be discussing what to study next. The second thing Quarterlife does is servant events, both at Campus Lutheran and Good Shepherd. Since Hannah, Katy and I came here, Quarterlife has served meals during the Student Lunch Servant event and Campus, and has helped pack shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child. The third thing Quarterlife does is fellowship. Hannah and I have had the group over for dinner and game night. We have had a start gazing night at Aaron's house. Quarterlife has participated in trivia night, and even won best table decoration for bringing a full ottoman. Quarterlife also came and celebrated Katy's 2nd birthday, where they participated in a myriad of different games.

ENDOWMENT FUND

ARE YOU FAMILIAR WITH THE CAMPUS LUTHERAN CHURCH ENDOWMENT FUND?

Did you know that Campus Lutheran Church has an Endowment Fund?

WHATIS AN ENDOWMENT? An endowment is a donation of money or property to a nonprofit organization, which then uses the resulting investment income to support the organization and its activities. In simple terms, an endowment is a fund with money in it, set up to provide long-term support. It can be said that 'A gift to an endowment is the gift that keeps on giving.' Since the goal of the Campus Lutheran Church Endowment Fund is long-term support, only earnings from the investment are made available to the church as described in the by-laws and policies developed by Campus Lutheran Church.

HOW DOES THE CAMPUS LUTHERAN CHURCH ENDOWMENT FUND WORK? The members of Campus Lutheran Church have established an Endowment Fund that is totally owned by Campus Lutheran Church and supports the missions of Campus Lutheran Church. Campus Lutheran Church has established by-laws and policies that specify the acceptance of gifts, investment of gifts, distribution of earnings to the congregation, and governance. The Campus Lutheran Church Endowment Fund was established using a Lutheran Church Missouri Synod model for congregations to follow. A person(s) gives a gift which is converted to cash, co-mingled with other funds, invested prudently for the long-run, and then the earnings returned to the congregation annually. The earnings are used for special activities, not to support the annual budget. The congregation, and in some cases the donor, specify the use...which have to dovetail with the congregation missions. Governance is by a congregation elected Board that oversees the Fund but does not specify the use of earnings.

Watch for upcoming issues of the Campus Lutheran Sojourner Newsletter where more information is forthcoming about the Campus Lutheran Church Endowment Fund, how gifts come into the Fund, and how this might fit into your lifetime plan for giving.

Notes from the Church Council

Shared Ministry Workgroup

The Shared Ministry Workgroup (sometimes called the "Turbo Team") is a team of members from Good Shepherd Lutheran Church and Campus Lutheran Church who have the capacity and will to attract volunteers and give their own time and efforts to launch new ministries in accordance with the congregations' Memorandum of Understanding of Shared Ministry. The intent of this agreement is to make the next generation of disciples from among our member households and among unchurched people in the region.

Purpose:

The Shared Ministry Workgroup will identify the ministries, resources, training, finances, volunteers and timeline to implement congregation-based ministry which will have a direct impact on making disciples.

Meeting Notes from February 8:

The Shared Ministry Workgroup met at Campus Lutheran on Feb. 8. Pastor Bill Geis attended our meeting to evaluate our progress and help give us some direction moving forward. The following items were discussed:

- 1. We reviewed our focus areas of shared ministry: Collaboration, Community Engagement, Contextualized Sharing.
 - Collaborative Ministry: Over the next three years Good Shepherd Lutheran Church will develop at least two significant ministries reaching people beyond Sunday morning worship (Examples: Bible studies, small groups, youth ministry, family ministry, etc.) that provide a substantive entry-point to welcome and disciple new families and students. Examples of this: Youth Ministry & Confirmation class, Pulpit exchange.
 - Community Engagement: Over the next three years Good Shepherd Lutheran Church will develop at least one NEW ministry outreach or community partnership which takes place in the community consistently (at least monthly). Good Shepherd Lutheran Church over the next three years will become known among many unchurched people in their community as a church that cares and is engaged with the community.
 - **Examples of this:** Second Saturday a community event in Centralia. Good Shepherd has a booth that focuses on children's ministry.
 - **Contextualized Sharing:** Good Shepherd Lutheran Church and Campus Lutheran Church will work together to discover and develop at least two ministry initiatives that strengthen their partnership over the next three years.
 - **Examples of this:** Possible Bible study/small groups from each congregation inviting friends from Hallsville.
- 2. We agreed to offer groups serving with the Missouri District in the "Week of Service"

Shine! (Apr 14-23). We are going to pray for, seek, and ask people outside of our "go-to" leaders for ideas where they have a passion/desire to serve our community as our first steps in identifying new Shine! serving activities.

- 3. We agreed to develop a prayer group to pray for needs of the shared ministry including: adding new leaders and connecting with inactive members.
- 4. We agreed to participate in an "Asset Mapping" exercise individually as congregation teams, and then together as a partners.
- 5. We will work on District Grant Application process
- 6. Next meeting: Tuesday, April 18 at Centralia
