

Meet New Student Worker: Alex Hopfer



Orange Nation is a part of the LCMS Young Adult Ministry. Often, you see them at the Gathering as "YAVs" or Young Adult Volunteers. Although being a YAV only lasts from ages 18-26yrs old, Orange Nation is open to anyone aged 18-30yrs with exceptions for those who are older and would still like to participate. Brandon Heath, who is the director for Orange Nation, works out the time and places for the yearly Orange Nation Servant Events. I was told they try to always have one the year after, and before each Gathering.

Overall review:

- We all arrived on July 19th, and served Camp Restore Detroit (CRD) until July 23. There was a total of 24 volunteers from Orange Nation who came, and participated in the work and activities set before us. With the work starting on July 20th, and ending July 22nd, we got to know the people on our set teams—there were three teams in total.
- We all put in a lot of hard work to help our Detroit neighbors, but it was well worth it. The jobs we did were difficult, but fun and rewarding! It was so incredible to see so many people working with a servant's heart and doing it to further God's reach. Each day, the different teams were tasked with different jobs and we all put in the same amount of heart into each project we had done and finished.
- The bible studies we participated in throughout the week revolved around Nehemiah, and our theme and theme verse for the week was "We Hope" and Romans 5:5. It was all based around the Detroit Moto: "Speramus meliora; resurget cineribus," which translates to "We hope for better things; it shall arise from the ashes."
- There were a few familiar faces from the 2022 LCMS Youth Gathering, so it was nice to get to know them that much better. As well as getting to know some new faces.
- The week in itself was a wonderful experience, and I would definitely do it again! The people who plan, and put it on, have wonderful hearts filled with so much of the Love of God. I greatly appreciate the opportunity to serve with them this last week, and am honored to get to know these people in the capacity I do.
- Camp Restore Detroit is always looking for volunteers to help out during the summer as well as the rest of the year.

ENDOWMENT FUND

CAMPUS LUTHERAN CHURCH ENDOWMENT FUND

An endowment is a donation of money or property to a nonprofit organization, which then uses the resulting investment income to support the organization and its activities. Since the goal of the Campus Lutheran Church Endowment Fund is long-term support, only earnings from the investment are made available to the church as described in the by-laws and policies developed by CLC.

HOW CAN I SUPPORT THE CAMPUS LUTHERAN CHURCH ENDOWMENT FUND?

Perhaps the most common way an endowment is funded is through end-of-life giving, through one's estate. These gifts can be, but are not limited to, from cash; transfer of assets such as CDs, stocks, or bonds; life insurance policies; unused retirement savings (IRAs, 401Ks, etc.); and real property.

Members of Campus Lutheran Church (CLC) and friends can, and have, given to the CLC Endowment Fund while living. Perhaps a special circumstance arrives and one wants to support the mission and ministries of CLC, but have the gift set aside forever, with earnings transferred to the church annually. These situations can occur annually like remembering a birthday, baptism date, or wedding anniversary. Sometimes special circumstances leave one with assets not needed, such as from an inheritance, or simply a special blessing that one wants to share. These situations, when one is living, can utilize the CLC Endowment Fund.

Gifts from any source are converted to cash, co-mingled with existing funds, and invested by the Fund Endowment Board. Annual disbursements are made from the fund and those support mission and ministries of CLC above and beyond the annual spending plan and budget. Which activities to support are determined by the congregation, sometimes with input by the donor, not by the Endowment Board.


