

SECOND LESSON – Romans 8:31-39**(God's Everlasting Love)**

What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? ³²He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? ³³Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. ³⁴Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. ³⁵Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? ³⁶As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered." ³⁷No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Rev. STANISH STANLEY

Born in Mumbai (Bombay) India as the son of a Lutheran Pastor, **Rev. Stanley** is an ordained minister of the India Evangelical Lutheran Church (IELC), the daughter and now Partner Church of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod.

Rev. Stanley has served as an IELC pastor at the Vasai Lutheran Malayam congregation in Mumbai. He also initiated a preschool and scholarship assistance program for Lutheran children in Kerala, South India, this in partnership with LeadaChild, a Recognized Service Organization (RSO) of the LCMS. Rev. Stanley finished his Ph.D. degree in Historical Theology at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis in May, 2016. His ministry formation theological education was at the United Theological College (UTC), Bangalore, India and then through a scholarship from UTC studied for his Masters in Cross-Cultural Theology at the Protestant Theological University, Kampen, Netherlands in 2006-07.

Since 2013 Rev. Stanley has been working at Christian Friends of New Americans (CFNA, St. Louis) as Coordinator of its After School tutoring program, and as Executive Director for CFNA since 2017. He is married to **Beena**, and they have been blessed with three daughters; **Catherine** age 16, **Riona** age 13, and **Alina** aged 8. They are members at Christ Memorial Lutheran Church, St. Louis, since 2008 when Rev. Stanley came to join the graduate school at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis.
