FIRST LESSON – Exodus 25:10-22

(The Presence)

“They shall make an ark of acacia wood. Two cubits and a half shall be its length, a cubit and a half its breadth, and a cubit and a half its height. ¹¹You shall overlay it with pure gold, inside and outside shall you overlay it, and you shall make on it a molding of gold around it. ¹²You shall cast four rings of gold for it and put them on its four feet, two rings on the one side of it, and two rings on the other side of it. ¹³You shall make poles of acacia wood and overlay them with gold. ¹⁴And you shall put the poles into the rings on the sides of the ark to carry the ark by them. ¹⁵The poles shall remain in the rings of the ark; they shall not be taken from it. ¹⁶And you shall put into the ark the testimony that I shall give you. ¹⁷“You shall make a mercy seat of pure gold. Two cubits and a half shall be its length, and a cubit and a half its breadth. ¹⁸And you shall make two cherubim of gold; of hammered work shall you make them, on the two ends of the mercy seat. ¹⁹Make one cherub on the one end, and one cherub on the other end. Of one piece with the mercy seat shall you make the cherubim on its two ends. ²⁰The cherubim shall spread out their wings above, overshadowing the mercy seat with their wings, their faces one to another; toward the mercy seat shall the faces of the cherubim be. ²¹And you shall put the mercy seat on the top of the ark, and in the ark you shall put the testimony that I shall give you. ²²There I will meet with you, and from above the mercy seat, from between the two cherubim that are on the ark of the testimony, I will speak with you about all that I will give you in commandment for the people of Israel.

SECOND LESSON – Revelation 7:9-17

(Sealed for Eternity)

After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, ¹⁰and crying out with a loud voice, “Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!” ¹¹And all the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, ¹²saying, “Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen.” ¹³Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, “Who are these, clothed in white robes, and from where have they come?” ¹⁴I said to him, “Sir, you know.” And he said to me, “These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. ¹⁵“Therefore they are before the throne of God, and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on the throne will shelter them with his presence. ¹⁶They shall hunger no more, neither thirst anymore; the sun shall not strike them, nor any scorching heat. ¹⁷For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of living water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.”

DISTRIBUTION

- All communicants are asked to fill out the “Communion Registration” portion of the Connection Card attached to the announcement bulletin and place it in the basket by the door when you exit the sanctuary.
- If you would like to avoid the chancel steps, please come forward after the *Agnus Dei* (or stand if you are seated in the front row). You will receive Communion on the main floor of the sanctuary and then return to your seats down the side aisle.
- After floor Communion is complete, an usher will begin directing those wishing to commune at the rail row-by-row. After receiving the bread and wine, please exit through the doorway near the Sacristy and down the side aisle. There will be a basket for used individual cups on your right as you exit. The dismissal will be spoken by the pastor when all have returned to their seats.
- For those needing to receive a gluten-free wafer, please hold out a closed hand and one will be served to you. If you require a non-alcoholic wine, please request it from the server. Those wishing to receive a blessing are asked to come forward and cross their arms to indicate that they wish to be blessed.
- Please refer to the laminated card in the pew rack for our Communion statement and ask the pastor or an Elder if you have any questions.
