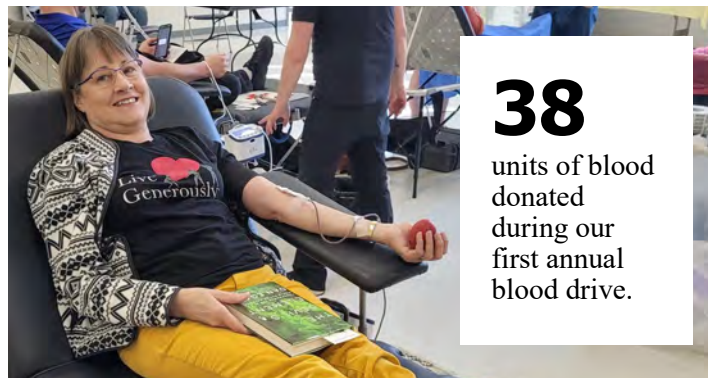

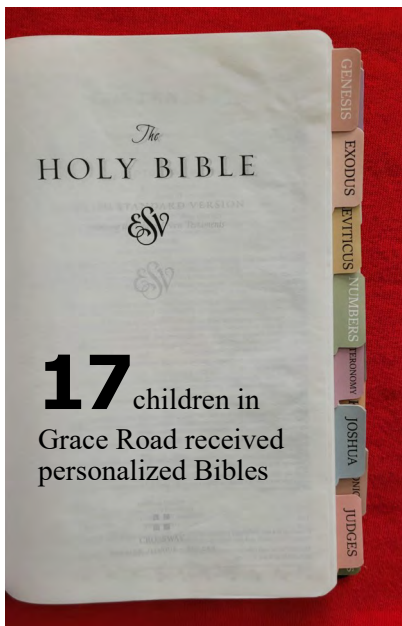

**35** different participants from seven different countries participated in American English for You.

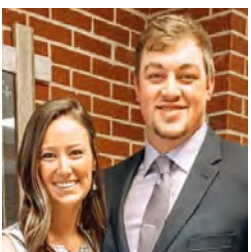
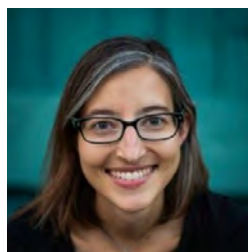
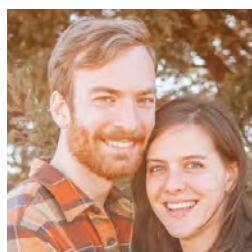
**2** times last year the International Library needed to be restocked with resources from The Lutheran Heritage Foundation.

# Reaching Out



**48** children participated in Grace Road, including four new families and 15 international families, which totaled 23 international children! These young scholars attended on Sundays and helped create special events like the Children's Christmas Service.

**80+** individuals attended the annual ice cream social, including 10 international friends and 26 students.
