Matthew 28:1–10



The dismissal will be spoken by the pastor when all have returned to their seats.
- For those needing to receive a gluten-free wafer, please hold out a closed hand and one will be served to you. White non-alcoholic wine is available in the center of the

servicing tray. Those wishing to receive a blessing are asked to come forward and cross their arms to indicate that they wish to be blessed.

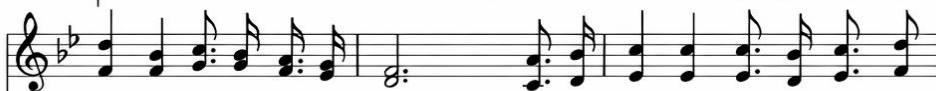

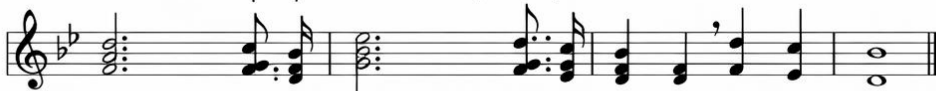

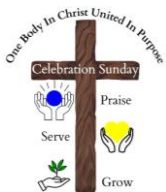
