## Discipleship and Family Life Ministry



### Kneeling for Justice.

I read a blog post from an LCMS pastor earlier this summer. It caught my eye because I heard the Rev. Gerald Bolling speak a few months ago. He is typical of many LCMS pastors; a man with a young family, a St. Louis Seminary graduate pastoring an older congregation in St. Louis.

When I attended a seminar which he co-led last fall, he talked about explaining to his young son about the way he should dress when he went outside their house. Again, a pretty typical father-son conversation, except Pastor Bolling and his family are black. I can't imagine how I would have explained to my kindergarten son why he couldn't wear a hoodie when leaving our own house. I never had to engage in that conversation, but it taught me that I wasn't as culturally aware as I thought. Sure, I have taught the history of civil war times to fourth graders and eighth graders, but the days of such disparity are over, right?

I grew up in a multi-cultural part of the country – Los Angeles. My state was multicultural, my county was multicultural, my schools were multicultural, my church was ... white. Which brings me to the title above which I borrowed from Pastor Bolling. You may be thinking that what a black man means by 'kneeling for justice' may not directly apply to you, but you may be incorrect. So was I.

Let me share some portions of Pastor Bolling's blog to show you where his thinking is going:

"In my office, I have a kneeler that I got off Craigslist from a Lutheran church that had closed many years ago... My vicarage (took place) at Bethlehem Lutheran Church – a church I now serve as pastor...

(While still a vicar,) I set my kneeler down, picked up my Bible, and read a verse that I have been reading periodically over and over again since that day.

He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God. (Micah 6:8)

As a young vicar, I reflected on those three statements, all the while knowing that the implications of justice in a city so divided by geography, color, creed, and class would be loaded. That justice, God's justice, was needed for a community torn apart... It called to the carpet systematic issues and hurts that serve as the scars of our city, the dents on our arch, the bruises on our buildings, that if impacted too often and too deeply, could no longer be tuck-pointed but rather would cause the entire structure to fall. God's mercy poured out over this city would need to be, as medicine to a wound, applied generously and re-applied as needed."

"The Christian Walk is a Marathon," Pastor Bolling points out, and he continues:

"I realized that our walk with God is not a short brisk walk around the track of the city parks covered by the horizon – a workout meant to keep the body beaten and the mind sharpened... No, this is a walk led by God for the purpose of dissecting the soul. This Christian walk, this step-by-step we take with God, is a walk in our awkward feet trod in the too-big shoes of our Father as we trip over words and slip into deeds we should not... As we seek forgiveness constantly, He picks us up and walks for us.

It's a marathon- but He runs it for us. He has a destination, though He doesn't give us a GPS play-by-play. His guidance and leadership help us to arrive home... In unjust times – *we kneel*.

As I said, I was raised in a multi-cultural part of the country. The emphasis of race-relations for me as a child was not to dwell on our differences. I'm thankful to my family for contributing that perspective, but I could have taken it a step further, and I am beginning to do so now. With God's help, I will emphasize the common ground of our faith. I will do justice. I will love kindness. I will walk humbly with our God.

### Angels and Demons

"Ye watchers and ye holy ones,  
Bright seraphs, cherubim, and thrones,  
Raise the glad strain: "Alleluia!"  
Cry out, dominions, principedoms, pow'rs,  
Virtues, archangels. Angels' choirs:  
Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!"

So begins a stalwart hymn of support for the members of the body of Christ which is also referred to as the 'church triumphant.'

What does the Bible teach about angels and demons and other related topics? As God's people, we should grow in our understanding of what He has revealed in Holy Scripture.

Our current hymnal, Lutheran Service Book (LSB) includes the liturgy of Matins, where we find the 'Te Deum Laudamus', an ancient hymn which contemplates the vastness of creation which continually worships our God. Matins is found beginning on page 223 in LSB. Spoiler Alert: For those of us who grew up with The Lutheran Hymnal (TLH), some modernization has taken place.

Medieval theologians developed a list of nine ranks of angels citing several Bible passages. In verse one of the 'Te Deum', each of nine groups or types of angels is called upon to sing praises to God. Subsequent verses others to join in; Mary, the mother of our Lord; patriarchs, prophets, apostles, martyrs and all the saints triumphant.

### Joining Jesus

Have you ever thought what it would have been like to travel around with Jesus? Its not to late to start. "Joining Jesus" is part of the title of a book by a Lutheran pastor named Greg Finke. The rest of the title is "Show Me How".

At Campus Lutheran Church, we are preparing for a 6-week dive into the topic beginning on September 13<sup>th</sup>. Pastor Kent will be back with a sermon series called ***Joining Jesus: Show Me How***.

Over the years, we Christians have made discipleship complicated. Look at the shelves in a Christian bookstore and you will find many resources to develop training programs. In Greg Finke's book, we find the task of being a disciple simplified. It involves five mission practices: Seeking the Kingdom, Hearing from Jesus, Talking with People, Doing Good and Ministering through Prayer. Here are a couple of quotes from the book to whet your appetite.

"Jesus is pursuing his Father's mission to redeem and restore all things. And he invites us to join him. We don't go *for* Jesus. We go *with* Jesus. We aren't Jesus-salespersons. We are Jesus-followers. We aren't pushy and presumptuous. We are watching and listening for where his grace can be applied and a little good can be offered."

"Joining Jesus on his mission is as simple as enjoying the people around us, investing in a couple of pre-Christian friends and then seeking, recognizing and responding to what Jesus is already up to in their lives. We position ourselves for this by putting the 5 Mission Practices into play every day:"

In conjunction with the sermon series, we want to encourage you to form a group or join a group to go a bit deeper into Joining Jesus. We will be providing books and study materials to assist in your study.

Perhaps you are wondering how to facilitate a small group. We will provide an orientation on Saturday, August 22 and Sunday, August 23. This is the same orientation offered twice for your convenience.

You may already be in a Bible study group, and that's great! We would love it if you could join us for a month and a half.

### How to Say Goodbye

This summer has been less than normal for Kevin and I, and I'm sure a lot of us can agree that quarantine (while effective at slowing COVID-19) has been painfully boring these last few weeks. Fortunately, God saw it fit to bestow a blessing upon all of us and bring the musical *Hamilton* to our tv screen, which has helped with the boredom. While reflecting on my leadership at Campus Lutheran coming to a close, I have had a hard time navigating how to say goodbye to my role in ministry and open my heart up to new ways God is working through my life.

At one point, some might say at the *highest* point, of George Washington's political career he decided to step down and allow others to take the lead. While watching *Hamilton*, I really admired Washington's leadership and ability to recognize that the very nature of the political system they were creating depended on him to eventually leave his position. This might surprise some, but a growing and healthy church ministry does not rely on the shoulders of the church staff, and especially on one church worker. Instead, if a ministry is healthy and growing the hope is that it sustains itself throughout leadership changes because God works through the people of the church and not just the staff. In the Lutheran church, we have a beautiful teaching and understanding of God's work through His people, it is called **The Priesthood of All Believers**. This teaching demonstrates that the people of God are all a part of the priesthood, and therefore our work and community with each other is what makes the church the church.

It has been awfully hard for me to say goodbye to aspects of my job because I hold the Student Ministry here so dearly to my heart. However, Kevin and I are both very confident this is the right decision for our family and for my own mental health. In teaching our students and other members to say goodbye to someone in leadership (even at a high point in their ministry), I hope it also encourages the importance of the body of Christ working together as one for the sake of God's mission.
