# Starting Something New

Earlier this year Campus Lutheran began operating under a new governance structure. Instead of a Church Council that included both elected officers and elected ministry Board Chairs, our Council now consists of our elected officers, the Chair of the Elders, and one At-Large member. What used to be our various Boards have, for the most part, been reorganized as Chartered Ministry Teams or Volunteer Director positions. The church staff works closely with the ministry teams and volunteers to help coordinate our congregation's

various ministries and to help us remain aligned to our mission of "Living and sharing the transforming love of Christ by reaching *UPWARD* in reliance on God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit as the source of our life, purpose, and salvation; *OUTWARD* to those who have not yet heard or experienced the Good News of God's life-saving love for them in His Son, Jesus Christ; and *INWARD* to support, encourage, and build one another up as brothers and sisters in Christ as we live out His calling for our lives."

While we are all still learning how to serve together in new ways, our journey forward under this new model of ministry is off to a great start. Here are some highlights to help you understand how our new system works:


- Weekly Staff Meetings Our staff (me, Pastor James Lanning, Vicki Smith, Beth Greimann, Hope Kane, Alex Hopfer) currently meets on Tuesdays at 8:00 a.m. We rotate leading devotions and prayers for our congregation. In addition to providing a structured time for communication and coordination, our weekly staff meetings help us keep our ministries aligned with the mission and vision of the congregation.
- Ministry Teams Since the adoption of the new governance structure the following ministry teams have been chartered: Student Ministry Team (Deanna Leimbach, Chairperson), Youth Ministry Team (Luke Lilienkamp & Jen Pierce, Co-Leaders), Social Ministry Team (Sarah Pellis, Chairperson), Parish Fellowship Team (Chris Vaughn, Chairperson), Education Ministry Team (Mary Ellen Lohmann, Chairperson). Ministry team charters are renewed annually. There is also flexibility to amend team charters and to add or remove teams as the needs of the congregation change.
- Volunteer Directors Mark Brakhane serves as the Church Property Director, and Rachel Skrabal serves as a our Stewardship Facilitator. Volunteer director roles are for one-year commitments.
- MAPS: Ministry Action Plans Various short-term and long-term ministries happen at Campus Lutheran throughout the year. Some are extensions of chartered ministry teams, and some are not. Ministry Action Plans (MAPS) are designed to give ministries, projects, and events accountability and to help ensure that they are aligned with the congregation's mission and vision.
- Church Council and Board of Elders The Church Council is entrusted with governance oversight of the congregation, working with the pastor to ensure that the congregation is living out its mission and that the operations of the church are being carried out. The Board of Elders is focused on the spiritual life of the congregation, and assists with and supports our worship services.

#### **Baptized Into Our Family**

At the begging of this year, Hannah and I met a wonderful woman named A\_\_\_, a graduate student from "Sourtheast Asia" who showed up at Campus Lutheran wanting to know more about Mormonism; she was welcomed in and recommended to our young adult group called quarterlife. She knew basically nothing about Christianity when we first met, and the language gap has been a challenge, but she has been coming faithfully to Quarterlife events since February and has even come to church at Good Shepherd. I and the members of Quarterlife have been working with her to teach her the stories and core doctrines of Christianity; the major challenges have been the language gap, the sheer amount of stories and theological concepts in the Bible, and the fact that Christianity has been completely foreign to her all of her life. The most difficult thing for me has been the doubt that I'm just not doing enough, that I haven't explained things well enough, or haven't prepared or planned well enough to effectively teach A\_\_\_\_ enough, as if my preparation, explanation skills, and planning could create faith in her. God has showed me how futile and silly my reliance on my own



intelligence and abilities are, as I have seen A\_\_\_\_'s faith grow, even as I have worried that I haven't done enough. A\_\_\_\_\_ asked to be baptized earlier this summer, and as of this past August, A\_\_\_\_\_ is now a baptized member of the family God, not because of anything she, or I, or anyone in Quarterlife did, but because God chose her and planted a seed of faith in her heart. I may not think that I said enough, that I didn't teach her enough of the story or explain enough of the core doctrine, that I didn't use the right words, but it's not about my words, or intelligence, or ability to effectively communicate, it's about God and His Word, which is more powerful than I can possibly imagine, and certainly more powerful than anything I could ever say or do.



#### OFFERING ENVELOPE UPDATE

The Church Council has decided, based on information provided by CLC's Financial Secretary John Sponaugle and further discussion, to no longer provide numbered offering envelopes to our members.

Offering envelopes will continue to be available in the pew racks. These same envelopes will be available in the Fireside Room for members to take home for use. Members are encouraged to take a year's supply of the offering envelopes if desired.

A major reason for this change is fewer people are using the numbered offering envelopes since a large amount of giving has moved to automatic bank drafts, IRA transfers, VENMO and loose checks; which are given without using an offering envelope.

As long as CLC's Financial Secretary has documentation (a check or available offering envelope) with a legible name and dollar amount, the necessary information can be recorded for end of the year giving statements. We also need to know if there is a specific area of ministry where a gift should be designated. Gifts without a designation will be credited to the general operating fund.













